From a very young age, this young lady from The Netherlands has demonstrated an incredible ability on a dirtbike which was proven when she finished inside the top five overall of the FIM Women's Motocross World Championship in her rookie season, 2013. Two seasons on, in 2015, Nancy won her first Grand Prix and was the eventual bronze medalist.

In 2016, Nancy was closer than ever to claiming her first world title with four race wins and two Grand Prix wins making her the vice world champion. In 2017 she can only go one better.
